Veterans Can Now Use the Home Depot Military Discount

All U.S. veterans, active-duty service members and their [spouses](#) now qualify for [Home Depot's everyday military discount](#) thanks to an expansion announced by the home improvement retailer.

The 10% military discount is also now newly valid for online purchases in addition to in-store shopping, officials announced in a press release. Qualifying shoppers must create an account and then verify their military status in order to access the discount online and through the [Home Depot app](#).

DIC eligibility for survivors of Blue Water Navy Vietnam Veterans

If the VA denied your Blue Water Navy Veteran's service-connected disability claim in the past, you may be eligible for DIC benefits based on the Blue Water Navy Vietnam Veterans Act of 2019.

Veterans who served on a Blue Water Navy vessel



off-shore of the Republic of Vietnam, or on another U.S. Navy or Coast Guard ship operating in the coastal waterways of Vietnam between November 1, 1955, and May 7, 1975, are now entitled to a presumption of [service connection for illnesses related to Agent Orange exposure](#). This is a result of Public Law 116-23, also known as the Blue Water Navy Vietnam Veterans Act of 2019.

Post 67 Meeting date and time:


